



FREEDOM OF INFORMATION LAW (FOIL) POLICY

The New York State Legislature declared that government is the public's business and that the public, individually and collectively, and represented by a free press, should have access to the records of government in accordance with the provisions of this article. The Freedom of Information Law (FOIL) is codified in the Public Officers Law §§84-90. It applies to all units of state or municipal departments, board, bureau, division, commission, committee, public authority, public corporation, counsel, office or other governmental entity performing a governmental or proprietary function for the state or any one or more municipalities thereof, except the judiciary or the State Legislature. It applies to the Monroe County Industrial Development Corporation, which will follow the FOIL policy and process of Monroe County.
